Priscilla Mae Schweim was born on April 1, 1925, to Ferdinand Herman Schweim and Ella Bertha (Luescher) Schweim on the family farm in Willow Lake Township Redwood County, Minnesota. She was baptized on May 25, 1925, and confirmed on May 12, 1940, at Bethany Evangelical Lutheran Church in Wabasso. She attended country grade school at District 94 and graduated from Wabasso High School in 1942.

Priscilla worked at several jobs in Redwood Falls following high school graduation. She worked as a waitress at the Ramsey Hotel and worked at the Strutwear Factory, the Falls Market, and the State Bank. In 1957 she moved to Minneapolis and worked at Northwestern National Bank. In 1958 her father died, and in 1959 her mother moved to Minneapolis to live with her. In 1965, she and her mother moved back to Redwood Falls to be closer to relatives. Priscilla worked at the State Bank for two years and then worked at the Redwood Falls Public Utilities until retirement.

Together, Priscilla and her mother did a lot of traveling throughout the United States and Canada. She enjoyed travel tours, especially her trip to Europe, where she had the opportunity to visit relatives in Switzerland.

Gardening, playing cards, and spending time with family and friends were some of her favorite pastimes. She had a wonderful sense of humor and believed that laughter was the best medicine.
